


















WITH SPRING COMES YOUR



After a long cold winter, it's time to get rid of the last little layer of fat in your body. Spring is here, and you went shopping and found the perfect bikini for the summer. Your fridge is stocked with an ample supply fruits, vegetables and lean meats. You got rid of all the junk and processed foods that cause your body to slow down and feel sluggish.

So what should I eat? Let me make it easy for you. Eat five meals a day. NEVER EVER skip breakfast. Are you listening? Make sure you eat something every 3-4 hours so that you don't starve your body and keep your blood sugar level at bay. Also, try to lay off the carbs. No, you don't have to cut them out, but try to consume the majority of your intake by lunch. Carbs are just another form of sugar and quick fuel for your body. The body will burn carbs for fuel before turning to the other macronutrients (proteins and fats) because less work is required to break down carbohydrates into glucose. Increase your protein intake. Not only will it make you feel fuller, but it will make your body reach into those fat reserves you lovingly accumulated over the years to keep the furnace going. Protein helps you build muscle. The more muscle you have, the more calories you burn.

I am asked this question frequently, and my answer NEVER changes. Before you ask again, NO! you may not eat at night. There's absolutely nothing in that fridge or cabinet that will do you any good whatsoever past 8pm. Digesting food while sleeping causes the blood sugar to go higher longer, since there is no activity to utilize the sugar. More of the calories go to fat.

Staying active and eating well-balanced meals is the key. Use food as fuel. If you are getting bored about always eating healthy, I have tons of healthy options and recipes on my website. Go check it out www.AgostinaFitness.com No more time to waste. Let's get started and do this full body workout. Remember to always consult your doctor first before engaging in any physical activities.

It's time to warm up. A warm up generally consists of a gradual increase in intensity in physical activity, a joint mobility exercise, and stretching. Warming up prepares your body and mind for your workout. My warm up lasts usually 10 minutes. You can warm up by walking uphill on a treadmill, getting on the elliptical, bike, or get the jump rope out of your closet and put it to use. Now that your body is warm and blood is flowing nicely to your muscles, it's time to train your body.

Below are your exercises for a kick butt routine. You will be performing all 6 exercises as a circuit, which means one after the other. Do 15 repetitions of each exercise, 3 times (rounds). Dumbbells are optional.

Circuit workouts are a great way to burn fat, and are also shorter than the average workout. Circuit training doesn't include any rest at all, so be aware of working at your own pace and take breaks when needed. If you are just starting, you might have to move at a slower pace and take more breaks than a participant who has been training for some time. Also, many people who do circuit training workouts only use 5 to 10 lbs. dumbbells, and sometimes their own body weight. Listen to your body, and if you need to drop the dumbbells or need to increase weight, re-adjust accordingly. Always make sure your workout is safe and effective and DON'T FORGET TO STRETCH!!!

- 1. Squats Standing position. Place your feet hip width distance apart. The movement is initiated by moving the hips back and bending the knees and hips to lower the torso, as if you were sitting back on a chair, then returning to the upright position. As you lower yourself down, it is very important that the knees stay behind your toes. Squatting below parallel qualifies the motion as a deep squat, while squatting above qualifies the motion as shallow. Caution is to be used when performing deep squats, as it places more pressure on the knee joint.
- 2. Agostina's 2 point extension Begin on your hands with your feet back in plank position/push up. Extend your right arms forward, as if you had little strings holding you from your fingertips, and your left foot straight back. Immediately touch your left knee with your right hand (advanced option is to bring your elbow to that opposing knee). Alternate sides. Repeat movement at a quicker pace once comfortable with motion.
- 3. Jump Lunges Same position as a lunge. Position one leg forward, with knee bent, and foot flat on the ground while the other leg is positioned behind (railroad tracks). Slowly lower your body down and then return it to the upright position. A good visual for this exercise is imagining you are a carrousel horse. You lower yourself down in a standing position without bringing your upper body forward or rounding through the spine. The difference on this exercise is the explosive or plyometric movement initiated from the ankles, knees and hips. Upon landing, attempt to absorb the load of the jump by landing on the front of your feet and then sinking back onto your heels, as the hips descend into the next squat.
- 4. Plank ups Get on the floor in modified plank position with forearms on the ground and elbows aligned under shoulders. Balance on toes or knees. Straighten left arm, then right. Hold full plank pose, then lower left forearm, followed by right, to the floor. Alternate sides and repeat movement at a quicker pace once comfortable with motion.
- 5. Burpess Start in a push up position. Jump your feet up toward chest, jump into the air and land softly back in a squat position. Bring hands to the floor and jump back to start position. Repeat the motion.
- 6. V-ups Sit upright with knees tucked into your chest, feet off the floor, and hands in a supportive position behind you. Extend legs out in front of you as you lower your upper body back towards the floor. Crunch back into start position and repeat.





Donatella Versace and Lady Gaga are not new friends. They have been spotted together many times in the past few years, and both are publicly gushing about the pairing for the campaign. Versace started the hashtag #VersaceLovesGaga, and Donatella has stated that Lady Gaga is "like family." Lady Gaga's dedication to the brand (and the woman) is hard to hide after the release of Artpop, her new album that features a song titled; you guessed it, "Donatella."



Erykah Badu

Pop isn't the only genre feeling the love this season. Neo-soul singer, Erykah Badu, is one of the new faces of Givenchy. Shot by Mert Alas and Marcus Piggott, the same pair responsible for Versace's S/S 2016 the icon is featured in the bold African and Japanese influenced collection.

Badu is known for being a voice that started the neo-soul genre, often referred to as the "Queen" or "First Lady of Neo-Soul." She is also a long-time activist and occasional actress. To pick a face with such a strong voice in music and activism is to make a statement with the collection. With the recent backlash against the fashion industry for discriminating against women of color, there is no better model to use. Designer Riccardo Tisci points out that Givenchy has always been vocal in promoting diversity in fashion and hopes that the campaign will help open the doors for other women of color in fashion.

Throughout the years, Juergen Teller has worked with Marc Jacobs on numerous campaigns, but the photographer refused to shoot Cyrus. Don't worry about your favorite ex-Disney girl, though. It was no big setback for

the superstar who has twerked her way into the hearts of millions. David Sims gladly shot the coveted campaign. The moody, dark beach shoot's concept was to have Cyrus and two friends in a forlorn, isolated environment.

Rihanna

Rihanna is the new model for Balmain. Designer Olivier Rousteing calls the collaboration a "dream come true," as Rihanna was actually the inspiration for the collection. The pop sensation, who ended last year strong by

pairing with Eminem for "Monster," is pictured in what appears to be a steam room with tattoos and black nails on display, donning chunky gold chains and jewelry to complete the princess-with-an-edge look. Shot in New York by Inez van Lamsweerde and Vinoodh Matadin, the campaign is described by Rousteing as making his vision "complete."

During the shoot, music blasted while Rihanna danced and "owned" the collection, according to Rousteing. She had a vision for the campaign, and the designer chose her as a strong woman to represent the brand. Rousteing explains that the collaboration was decided after six months of budding friendship.



When I work with Emma I can tell her exactly what I'm looking for and she does an amazing job. She also designs my performance outfits based on the concept of the songs. My other favorite designers are Jeremy Scott and DVF. I also really like a fashion designer called Elie Madi, I wore his couture dresses to the recent music awards in China—they were absolutely gorgeous!

It was a very inspiring trip and during it I wrote one of my biggest hits – "Bubble"!

Tell us the biggest difference in fashion between China and US and does this affect your style?

The differences don't really affect my style. When it comes to performance outfits, my stylist designs each outfit based on the overall concept of my album or the concepts of each song.

Tell us about your upcoming Movie, Charming.

I am playing the role of Sleeping Beauty. I'm so excited and happy because the first song that I ever wrote when I was 13 was actually named "Sleeping Beauty". I never thought that I would have a chance to play a "Sleeping Beauty" role in a movie, so it feels amazing! I heard you were up for all kinds of awards, also listed in Forbes "30 Under 30" both Global & Asia list. How did you feel when receiving all this recognition at the beginning of the year 2016?

I'm extremely flattered. It gives me a lot of motivation to work even harder because all of the hard work you put in will pay off in the end!

I would love to start getting everybody moving here in the west, and encourage them to chase their dreams.

Thank you! I had a blast doing the RUNWAY shoot. I always look forward to being shot by Joe Simpson, he's a real pro!

I do like Fashion and I do dress up a lot... for movie premiers, fashion shows, family occasions, modeling and events. I like to stand out and be different. I have my own personal style.

the Closet

As women, we all have many things we are constantly juggling. We juggle our careers, our families, our social calendars, charity obligations and, if we are lucky, juggle our time to shop and keep a wardrobe fresh. With all of these tasks one might wonder, when do we have time to organize such things, let alone do them all?

Any girl with a fabulous collection of clothes, shoes and accessories deserves an organized home to keep it all in, and I am here to help you find a simple way to put your closet together nicely. First, you need to take inventory. Choose a day to sort through what is currently in your closet. Go through EVERYTHING, every single thing. It may get worse before it gets better but I promise you it is worth it. You will be making three piles: keep, donate and throw away. I know as a woman I get sentimental when going through this process, and I can tell you it has taken me a few of these sit-down sessions in front of my closet to make myself purge the unnecessary items. For instance, I had a hard time parting with a maxi-dress that I purchased while in the Caribbean. It no longer fit as a result of my slim down. I knew I never wanted to wear this dress again, but I was determined to keep it. The dress symbolized fond memories of my trip. I finally compromised by pinning the postcard from the tropical locale to my office corkboard, said farewell to the dress and moved on. Once you have done this task (and I will tell you that it is probably one of the most time consuming tasks of all), you can celebrate that the hardest part is behind you. Now we will work on the closet interior itself.

Making the space. This is your space, so make it uniquely yours. If you cohabitate with a spouse or roommate, you should get permission before making any permanent changes. A great place to start is with storage and shelving. If you have a traditional walk-in closet or sliding door closet, rods and shelves should already be installed. When deciding to add additional modular storage cubes or shelves, take inventory of how you utilize your closet space. If you have a lot of shoes and handbags, but not many dresses, you could use more of your space installing shoe racks and upper shelving than using long, open spaces. If your collection is mainly long dresses, or work suits, use the higher storage for shoes and let the longer items hang freely without interference from beneath them. Once your storage set-up is in place, add color! Paint the back walls, or even just a coat of paint on an accent wall will make the space pop. Add a small mirror, a chandelier, or use a nice shelving paper to line your shelves. This does not just help protect your shelves, but it also looks pretty. A word of advice:



simpler is better in such a small space, so use a lighter palette. Your clothes are the main attraction; this just gives them a nice backdrop.

Neat and tidy. One of the easiest ways to keep your closet looking organized and clean is to keep the floor clear. Resist the urge to use the closet as storage, or drop shoes inside the closet on the floor. Pair shoes together on a rack, or in boxes on higher shelving. It will protect the shoes, as well as keep your space clear. Having a space for folded shirts or jeans is a great addition, as well as giving it a clean retail feel. Who doesn't love feeling that they are shopping every time they get dressed in the morning? Save the hangers for your dresses, suits, pants, wrinkle prone items and delicate pieces. I would advise investing in some nice hangers, perhaps wood, satin or at the very least, matching colors in plastic to help bring unity to the arrangement. Resist bunching clothes close together, as you want the fabrics to be able to breathe. This will also decrease the chance for wrinkling. 

It adds additional space to keep make-up, perfumes, and allows you to have a mirror and small stool in the closet. This is convenient for seeing outfit pieces together or putting on shoes. If you have a walk-in that opens to the bedroom or bathroom, hanging a lace camisole or feminine gown adds a luxurious touch to the overall look.

Jewelry. If you are like me, you may have an abundance of accessories. Scarf, jewelry, and sunglass collecting seems to be my favorite hobby. As I mentioned earlier, I have a small vanity set up in the back of my closet, which is home to a nice jewelry dresser. I have my necklaces hung on decorative hooks to add a vintage feel to the overall look of the space, as most of my necklaces are antique. Decorative hooks may be purchased at any craft store. You can alternatively use a beautiful wood frame with the glass removed. Insert chicken wire, or string thin metal wire behind and secure to the back of frame. Once upon a time, there was a little girl who had big dreams. These dreams included destinations to faraway places that many can only imagine. In these dreams, there were cities of beauty, culture, lifestyle, sights and history. To have the chance to bring the reality of those dreams to life is the dream of numerous individuals, not just

population of approximately 2.2 million people. Part of the attraction to Paris is the nature of its being a hub for education, business,

science, politics, fashion, shopping, arts and media. What stands out, however, is the historical and cultural heritage that goes deep and wide. When visiting Paris, there are many glorious sights to see. We will highlight a few, as there are too many to

Avenue Nicholas II, looking towards the Dome of the Invalides, is probably one of the most recognizable Domes ever. The dome itself is 107 meters high, making it one of the tallest monuments in Paris. It is centrally placed to reflect honor for many of the country's war Heroes. This is accomplished by utilizing buildings within 15 courtyards. The inside disciple of the well-known 18th century French painter, Charles Le Brun.

Another central landmark in Paris is the Louvre Right Bank of the Seine in the 1st (neighborhood) arrondissement. It is known to be the most visited museum in the world, and is possibly the most famous

one. There are almost 35,000 objects exhibited from the 6th millennium BC to the 19th century AD. The museum is housed in the Louvre Palace (Palais du Louvre) which began as a fortress built in the late 12th century under Philip II. Remnants of the original fortress are still visible.

One of the most famous locations in Paris (that dreamers and lovers often want to experience) is the Eiffel Tower at Champ de Mars in Paris. The tower was built by Gustave Eiffel in 1889 for the World Fair, where it has been remembered as the star attraction. It held the title as the tallest man-made structure for 41 years. There are two main levels for visitors. It is approximately 300 steps to the first level, and then another 300 steps to the second level. Each of those levels include a restaurant for visitors. There is a third level, however, and this is only assessable via lift and is not normally available to the public for viewing.

Notre Dame de Paris is one of the most prominent examples of Gothic architecture in both France and in Europe. The naturalism of its sculptures and stained glass are in contrast with earlier Romanesque architecture. The Cathedral was built in 1163, with the new gothic style that had to reflect Paris' status as the capital of the Kingdom France. It was also the first cathedral built on a monumental

scale. It became the prototype for future cathedrals in France, like the cathedrals of Amiens, Chartres or Rheims. Notre Dame surpasses the Eiffel Tower as the most visited monument in Paris and all of France.

The beautiful and lovely monument of Fontaine Saint Michel is located at Place Saint-Michel in the 5th arrondissement in Paris. It was constructed in 1858-1860, during the French Second Empire by the architect Gabriel Davioud. A notable sculpture by Francisque-Joseph Duret (which depicts Archangel Michael and the devil) is the centerpiece of the Fontaine Saint-Michel.


