AN INTERVIEW WITH JULIA CLANCEY

What first sparked your interest in fashion design?

I have always loved dressing up and used to try and predict trends when I was very young. My Aunty gave me my first sequin boob tube and my Mum would take me shopping on a Saturday. I was the first person in York to get satin trousers as I was obsessed with Olivia Newton John in Grease.

What types of pieces did you design in the beginning of your career and how has your line evolved since?

Being self-taught I never really had chance to experiment as to what my aesthetic was but many of the first silhouettes of the silk blouses have remained timeless. I would still put them in my collection when I expand the ranges. The collections were predominantly silk and they still are. I am trying however now to find options of a more ethical silk. I have designed jumpsuits from the very beginning and still one of the most in demand styles. There were some pieces which were designed really more for press however one cannot live purely on press so flipped completely the brand into a very commercial one of party silk chiffon dresses. My sales were great but felt I had sold myself short of any longevity for the brand. So I reworked the collections not wanting to be pigeon holed in a line I was not passionate about. My new collection was then stolen in LA right before a show. So I took a break and ended up in costume design for films. It has been quite the journey! I design for comfort with the maximum glamour for ladies of all ages and sizes. Although I do still do the odd custom gown my specialty is kaftans, turbans and jumpsuits.

One of your turbans was recently featured on the cover of Sports Illustrated in a beautiful shot of the first woman to wear a burkini in the magazine. How does it feel to be featured in such a poignant shoot and what inspired you to create your line of turbans?

That was an incredible moment and have worked for some time on bridging the gap of East meets West. A controversial editorial for many but people need to stop looking at things as being either black or white. By celebrating that cover it does not for one moment mean we are forgetting about all the ladies who have no choice in the matter.

Do you have a favorite colorway or material to work with?

Gosh I love playing with color ways. It is the one's that you think will never work that give me the most joy. Yellow is my go to happy turban color. Mango is also very complimentary. Lilac and yellow is my current one. I am starting the journey to use more sustainable fabrics. The new collection has an organic cotton French Terry cloth which is produced in California. We currently operate on 100% zero waste donating the tiniest of scraps to local schools and charities including Art of Elysium for art projects. As designers we have to address this huge problem. Still so much research to do.

Who are some of your favorite designers?

Hmmm as an ex stylist I appreciate so many. I stock in Harrods and recently walked through the store on the way to staff training .My jaw was constantly dropping. There is so much color and fun out there at the moment. Pucci for prints, Valentino for romance, Manish Arora for all that is playful and fun, Julien Macdonald for the most exquisite embroidery. I have always been a big Dolce Gabbana fan too. I could go on...oh Anna Karin Karlson does THE best eyewear.

What is your favorite go-to outfit in your closet?

My sequin Gloria jumpsuit.

Having relocated to Los Angeles from London, what are some of the differences you've noticed in the fashion sense of the two cultures and how have the varying sensibilities affected your designs?

My goodness so different but we have such different climates and well cultures. I am a bit old fashioned as love nothing more than well cut tailored Saville Row suit on a chap. Men in the L.A. have a tendency to wear suit jackets that are too big because they are too hot. London has always been more experimental when it comes to fashion. That being said everybody wants to come here and feeling positive there may be some exciting much needed changes ahead for the industry. My collections are worn equally between the U.S. and Europe. I travel so much back and forth that not sure it really effects the designs.

Where has been your favorite place to show and why?

London was always a great buzz. I showed with Style Fashion Week at Pacific Design Centre in West Hollywood a couple of years ago. I adore that location.

So many celebrities have worn your designs, even Madonna chose to wear one of your kaftans to her Oscar party this year. What is it like to see such an icon wearing your design?

Incredible. Madonna is the Queen. Jennifer Lopez is an absolute Goddess too. I have to pinch myself. Growing up having these people as icons and then dressing them is a little surreal at times. I get a huge buzz seeing anyone in my designs and enjoying them. My friend just sent me a video of his Mum dancing around the room in one of my kaftan's which was a joy.

Who would you love to dress in one of your pieces in the future?

Well there are some icons who I would live to dress. Three that spring to mind are Grace Jones, Diana Ross and Joan Collins are two that spring to mind.

What can we look forward to in your next season?

Well I launched my Kiddy Kaftan line "Moi et Le Petit Pois ' of matching Mum and Daughter kaftan's so you will be seeing more of that in some fun prints.



I acted when I was a child, I was about 5 years old. Disney wanted me for one of their shows but I got scared and refused to do it. My mom hasn't let me live it down. I spent my whole life missing it, and finally returned to it in my twenties after I graduated college.

What was it like growing up in Canada?

Cold. Good people. Great health care.

What city do you call home now?

I spent most of my off season in LA, where my sister lives with her kids, my niece and nephew, whom I'm totally obsessed with.

Got any pets?

I used to have two goldfish named Posh and Becks. I want a dog but my building doesn't allow pets in Vancouver, which might mean moving to a new spot very soon.

Tell us about the video games you worked on.

I have worked on so many video games and I absolutely love doing them. Running around in a spandex leotard in the motion capture volume gives you so much physical freedom. It's a far cry from some of the heavy military attire I wear on live action TV shows. Envisioning the world you're

playing in, and reacting to it is such a fun exercise of the imagination. I feel like a little kid. Watch Dogs was awesome because I was playing a graffiti artist slash parkourist (is that a word? because that's what I was). Mass Effect was awesome because I got to play everything from a commander, to a pirate queen, and a variety of aliens; each with their own distinct physical signature and movement, which was challenging but creatively rewarding. Motion capture allow you to explore characters in a completely different way because you're forced to rely on your imagination a lot more. The sky is the limit.

Tell us about your own personal style.

I look to the seventies for a lot of my style inspiration - I pull from Rock n Roll royalty like Bianca Jagger, Jerry Hall, and of course Cher for their fashion sensibility about mixing edge, glamour, and earthiness. I love mixing colors, styles, textures, and just having fun with fashion. It should be exciting and you should be able to bend the rules a bit to suit your mood that day. I'm also obsessed with maxi skirts and dresses, which I live in.

Do you ever use your personal style in any of your character?

I just wrapped a movie where I got to pull a lot of my own wardrobe for the character I was playing, which was really exciting. Jaq was a world traveler, and her style pulled influences from all over the place, so I got to really explore and play with how she expressed herself through what she wore. Sometimes when she was feeling saucy, I would pull some louder pieces from my own wardrobe and bring them to set as a suggestion. Some worked, some didn't, but I did get to rob a gas station wearing my favorite emerald green shaggy coat. That was a big win!

What was your favorite moment on the set of "The 100"?

There have been so many great moments but I will never forget my first episode where I was under the impression I would only be there for one. I got the chance to work with Bob, who was amazing, and it gave me the first taste of how great this show is and that it was something I'd want to do for a long time. Thank God they called me back!

What is coming next for you?

Break Even should be released next year, and you'll get to see which of my favorite personal fashion items made the final edit. Keep your fingers crossed for my green shag fur coat!! The world needs to see me holding up the gas clerk in fur!

What is your favorite thing about fashion?

I love how fashion can both change the mood and vibe of a person or a room or situation; and I love how fashion is or can be an expression of an individual's imagination... A lot like Music in this way.

How old were you when you started in music?

My mom used to tell people I learned to play violin in the womb, and it was very irritating! Actually, I had a dream I could play violin when I was seven and I told my mom and she was cool enough to take me directly to the music store where we found a little violin for me to play. She actually wrote a song for me the day we got my violin. She wrote the song in G major, which means that I could play the open strings of the violin with her immediately, without even knowing how to play, giving me a Love and fluidity with music that has carried me through my whole life!

What is your favorite genre of music?

I grew up playing classical music and listening to my mom's original songs, and was pretty much not exposed to most contemporary music. When I finally did start listening to Rock and pop it really just sounded like an extension of the classical music I had spent my childhood playing, and I never really related to genre per se as much as I related to what music made me feel and if it was authentic. I like anything that feels authentic - where I can feel the heart of the creator. I've collaborated with people from every genre including jazz and rock 'n' roll and heavy-metal and Pakistani devotional music, and the music I listen to on my own ranges from Rachmaninoff to Radiohead to Bulgarian women's choir's and Malian Kora music and beyond. My collaboration with the extraordinary musicians in Opium Moon is born of my love for music from other cultures, with our Persian hammered dulcimer player and Israeli fretless bass player and percussionist with all sorts of ethnic and ancient Instruments. The violin can really be found in every culture around the world in some form.

Tell us about your personal style?

My mom, comedian Lotus Weinstock had a take on fashion: "if you only have one toe, you should not wear thongs!" I took that to mean that just because something is the latest fashion doesn't mean you should wear it if it doesn't suit your body or spirit. I tend to like clothes that are colorful and draw on influences from other cultures, as well as a little bit sexy and funky and elegant. I also dress differently for different occasions naturally... As a film composer, I have to keep my persona as an artist, but be elegant and subtle enough so people will trust me with their films! On stage, anything goes, and I

especially like things that are a little bit sexy and daring and timelessly unique in a way that makes

me feel a bit bold and dangerous. An outfit can change your attitude and a whole concert!

What's your favorite color?

That's like asking me what my favorite note is. Depends on my mood and the time of day and what's happening around me! I do tend to like jewel tones because they're flattering to my complexion and eyes.

Tell us about your favorite red-carpet designers?

I love Eli's Saab, Vivienne Westwood, Dalia McPhee, Shala Dorriz (designed my Grammy dress)

What was it like to win a Grammy?

I've been playing music since I was seven and seen so many brilliant artists do extraordinary work and be unrecognized, so it feels good, but very humbling to be acknowledged by my peers for doing what I do, and for all the years of practicing and devotion, especially for this particular record which is born of so much heart and not at all trying to be commercial.

Tell us about some of your collaborations musically. I've had the great honor of collaborating with legends like Herbie Hancock, George Clinton and Parliament funkadelic, Roger Waters, Jimmy page and Robert Plant, Sting, Hans Zimmer (from whose Studios I begin to score films), Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan, and the LA Philharmonic... All of whom have inspired me and forced me to simply surrender to the flow of inspiration and listening, because in so many of these situations I hadn't really earned the right to be involved - but the spirit came through and carried me.

Who do you look up to?

I look up to anyone who has devoted their lives to making something beautiful, or making a difference or helping people or realizing the full potential of their vision. More specifically, I'm inspired by a Dutch classical violinist named Janine Janson, I love a new composer named Nicholas Brittell (Moonlight) and of course Ennio Morricone. I love Sinead O'Connor's voice, but there are so many brilliant artists to look up to... I believe it was a Sufi poet Hafiz who said you should treat everyone as if they were your guru saying their last dying words.

Do you have a favorite charity?

I have a lot of favorite charities. I feel the ACLU is particularly important right now in the midst of the assault on all of our civil liberties and rights. I also give to Planned Parenthood, Human Rights Watch, AmeriCares, and Los Angeles mission. Homelessness in Los Angeles has risen by 70% in the last few years.

What would you change about the world if you could?

Wow... So much... I think the source of most problems has to do with power and the way we dominate each other - the domination paradigm... From racism, homophobia, police brutality, economic inequality, domestic violence, sexism, animal cruelty, rape of the environment... If we could move beyond domination to a paradigm of respect and really seeing and hearing each other, I think most problems would disappear and people would be kinder and honor the divinityin each other. One of my favorite quotes is "It's a little embarrassing that after 45 years of research & study, the best advice I can give people is to be a little kinder to each other." - Aldous Huxley I try to give as I go, and take the time to be kind to everyone I meet as much as possible... I certainly have faltered in that regard, but I'm working on it! I will say that the leaders in public life do set a tone for the rest of us and the level of cruelty that has arisen since Trump has been in office has been very concerning to me. I am with Bernie Sanders or anyone who gets the Democratic nomination. But more important than the personality of a leader is an activated citizenry...now is the time to stand up for what we believe...for me that's basic human rights - clean air and water, climate justice, right to healthcare and good education, equality under the law, and primacy of people over profits.





What's up next with you?


My group Opium Moon has a new single coming out May 31 - our groovy exotic version of the Rolling Stone's Miss You. I have a new film (score) coming out about iconic Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg, and a couple of other films that just came out, and some touring with Opium Moon - and we are making a new record. Always up for a great collaboration and on my way to Africa to perform at the Angola jazz festival with my own band with whom I have a new record almost ready to go.

Charlie, is always running up or down the stairs. I had on a pair of boots that were a half a size too big and lost my footing.

Got any advice to young adults who appreciate your talent?

I appreciate anyone who appreciates my talent. My favorite piece of advice is create the life you want to live. We are creators born to create. Why not create the life of your dreams?

How long is a fun day shopping?

24 hours. I love shopping. I'll got to 100 stores if I have the time. I don't often have the time. So I have to be strategic and swift. I cheat by grabbing the manican's look or the model on the ads look. It's makes shopping easy. All the work is done for me

What is your favorite shop in the mall?

I prefer to support private designers and black owned businesses.

What's up next with you?



I found this same camaraderie on set with the lead actors playing her friends on set.

Who would be your perfect co-actor?

I would choose Timothée Chalamet and/or Saoirse Ronan to be in a scene with me. Both are excellent actors. I am a fan of the film Lady Bird, both embrace their roles in this film and pull me in.

What is up next for you?

I have a little bit of news for fashion, film and music lovers. For the fashionistas out there, I'm doing a collaboration with the Runway Dubai 2019 show. I'm collaborating as a style icon for one of the challenges. This will be fun. So, stay tuned as it unfolds. For the film lovers, the big news is the full length feature film Summertime Dropouts. I talked a little bit about my character "Lucy" from Summertime Dropouts. I'm one of the 6 lead characters in Summertime Dropouts alongside Quinton Aaron (Blindside), the Canadian punk rock band Simple Plan (Welcome To My Life). Summertime Dropouts

produced by Winterstate Entertainment will premiere this summer in July 2019. Another exciting acting tidbit is the short thriller titled Nasty Habits, that is currently on the film festival circuit. I have been awarded three Best Actress awards for this film already. The film itself is stacking up the laurels in all categories. In this film, I'm starring as "Georgia Dean" who is a singer-songwriter hitch-hiking her way to Los Angeles with the hopes of becoming famous. This film is written and directed by Allisyn Arm (AP BIO). I also have a recurring role in the TV series NC16. Music lovers looking for new music, you can add my single GOLD to your playlist. If you haven't already listened to my new single GOLD, Check the link below. I'm very excited about GOLD being released to the public. I write my own lyrics and melodies and work step by step with a producer/engineer to create the produced sound. GOLD is available on all popular music streaming and downloading sites. I'm now working on the second song in this EP collection, the song is titled Car Talks. Watch for its release this summer.
