people put into this issue. I like to keep our best foot forward and put our hearts out to the people who have been lost.



Well I'm inspired by the first responders who are out there fighting COVID-19 and all the people that are staying home and helping us flatten the curve! Thank you!



My design philosophy is that women and men of every shape and size should have access to clothing that makes them feel great about themselves.

How did you first get started as a Fashion Designer at such an early age?

I took the first steps towards making my dream a reality while attending university and working on my Mechanical Engineering degree. It was then that I saw my first runway video on YouTube. It ignited something in me, and, instantaneously, I knew this was what I wanted to do with my life. Soon after I received my degree, I set out to create a brand that would one day attain international recognition: JONATHAN MARC STEIN.

I am a self-taught designer who also trained myself to sew. I transitioned to full-time designing beginning January 2018, including sewing/tailoring all garments created for the JONATHAN MARC STEIN brand.

What designers have influenced you?

Several designers come to mind that influence me as a fashion designer.

Alexander McQueen made a name for himself at a young age for his precise/quality tailoring, mixing leather with more feminine fabrics and combining traditional and edgy styles. I aspire to do the same.

I also relate to Alexandre Vauthier's modern, edgy style with black and metallic fabrics plus leather to make a bold statement and unique embellishment, setting his pieces apart from the masses.

What inspires you?

My inspirations come through a variety of interactions. Cool architecture may spark a thought for a unique garment structure. People seen on the streets, in movies, and walking in the neighborhood all spark ideas from their apparel and the colors they choose. The wide pallet of hues and textures in nature will sometimes conjure up innovative ideas.

I truly enjoy designing wearable art and seeing the smiles on peoples' faces when they wear my garments with confidence. That brings me immense joy and reminds me why I started designing in the first place. As a fashion designer, the reality is that there are peaks and valleys. My favorite handbag is my Hermès Kelly.



What have you been doing during quarantine?

Staying home and making things: food, shoes, clothes, furniture, textile art, pottery, watercolor. If I have the materials to create it, I'll do it.

You make your own clothes and shoes. What are some of your favorite patterns and fabrics?

I prefer breathable fabrics whenever possible in linen, high-quality cotton, and silk blends. I'm really into polka dots and hues in my seasonal color palette right now. Seasonal palettes are a bit of an old-school approach to fashion and beauty, but after reading the original (problematic, but informative) book on color palettes for skin types that came out in the 70's, it all connected for me and it has had a huge impact on the types of clothes I make and the outfits I now put together. I will always have a place in my heart for Big 4 patterns (Vogue, McCalls, etc), but I prefer working with indie patterns...the fit is usually better requiring less adjusting and the instructions and construction techniques are often more thoughtful and nuanced.

What is your favorite type of art?

I love the type of art that is usually labeled as "craft" and therefore considered "women's work" and not valuable enough to be considered high art. It is a product of our society's inherent misogyny that puts functional craftsmanship like weaving, basket making, pottery, quilting, etc. into categories that are deemed less dignified than "art". It is not a coincidence that much of this art comes from poorer communities of color. I love the intersection of modern artists with centuries-old craft and am always excited to see how they innovate within the realm of art.

What is your favorite type of music?

I love soul music, but as long as it has a groove and I can sing to it, it's probably in my rotation.

What was your favorite subject in school? English.

How do you relax?

By making. Knitting and pottery have proven to be very therapeutic ways for my brain to relax and regulate my body's breathing while I focus my energy into something tangible and malleable.

Tell us about your role on The Good Doctor. What have you enjoyed most? What has been the most challenging?

I play a pathologist named Dr. Carly Lever. I have most enjoyed working with Freddie Highmore, he is a dream scene partner and I am lucky to have spent pretty much all of season 3 with him. The most challenging aspect has been having to field the hateful and sometimes racist reactions from fans who either didn't want to see Shaun end up romantically with my character, or felt deeply uncomfortable at seeing an interracial relationship portrayed on TV.

Did you like school?

I loved school, because I knew it was the only way I was going to get myself out of the South. Thankfully I was good at school and was able to focus much of my energy into doing well so that I could get scholarship money to go to college. I grew up very poor and I knew the chances of me having the kind of life I wanted to lead as an adult were going to rely on me having some kind of higher education, but I feel resentful that opportunities for poor people of color are so few and far between. We already start out at a deficit when you consider the effects of both generational poverty and trauma on BIPOC communities, and then we have to work doubly hard to compete with people who grew up with more resources, access and institutional support.

Do you have any pets?

We have a Pitbull named Rosie.




What is the funniest thing that's happened to you on set?


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

A vision for what I want to accomplish! It's hard to feel inspired if you don't know what you're trying to do. I need to know what I'm actually aiming for.


What's up next for you?























Tell us about your personal style.

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
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








































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












Women who love thier Custom Motorcycles an interview with Frank Sanchez

If music is ever playing, it is usually classic rock.

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




























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
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
