












# JESSICA MORRIS

#### Tell us about your personal style.

My family and friends make fun of me, because I would not be caught dead without my hair, make-up, nails, and heels. On the other hand, however, I am still that 18-year-old Philly, Jersey, East Coast girl who loves to run around in off-theshoulder sweatshirts, my Eagles, Rams, or Yankees sports jogging pants...and hair, make-up and heels! My style goal is to always to look classy, yet comfortable, and to make a statement, without overdoing it. Most importantly, I make sure my style is personally authentic and starts from within!

#### Which designers do you wear on the red carpet?

I have been fortunate to have worn many! A share for your readers is... since I am short and curvy, it is not always super easy to fit or style my figure. I feel it is important for women outside of Hollywood to know that, as we are all perfectly imperfect! Now, back to the "perfect" designers I have worn to many red carpet events and premieres. I must shout out to one of my favorites, as not only did the Beverly Hills boutique style me for the Women In Film Crystal + Lucy Awards one year, but for the Soiree portion of my wedding: JOVANI! Another designer I was introduced to, and loved, for the carpet was Chiara Boni, whose gown I wore to the Costume Designer Guild Awards one year. I wore the most stunning burgundy gown by Halston to the Lambda Legal West Coast Liberty Awards and last, but not least, I have worn many gowns designed by Ralph Lauren, as they fit me so perfectly with my shorter legs, smaller waist and voluptuous chest and hips. When it comes to my platform heels, my own closet is no stranger to 6-inch Louboutins, Giuseppe Zanotti, Brian Atwood, and Alexandre Birman. I am heels obsessed!

#### How has COVID-19 affected your work? We see you have a lot of projects in post-production.

What a new experience COVID-19 has been for me, my life, and my work! I, unfortunately, am one who is immunocompromised, so it changed the trajectory of my year in many ways. My husband and I chose to completely self-isolate in our home. I cannot express how different this has been for me, as I am the Queen of socializing, tending to friendships, and, as you mentioned, attending many Hollywood red carpet events. I have not been able to go to auditions or in-person production meetings, so I locked myself in my home office and threw myself into our projects we were so fortunate to film last Fall. I have been able to work virtually with my different production teams, and although some aspects have been pushed way back, as far as moving product to distribution, premieres, festivals, etc... this home isolation time has offered me so much more time and energy to work on postproduction and take virtual meetings for future projects. I know we have a few projects to discuss in our interview, but I want to shout out to a special film that I have had so much fun working on virtually with one of my besties during the pandemic. My Psycho Therapy (Amazon Prime) film director, Staci Layne Wilson, wrote

a film with Darren Gordon Smith (Repo! The Genetic Opera). Those two are so talented, and add our producer, Nancy Long, and editor, Nina Hirten, to our mix. It is a fun indie gem. I do not want to give any spoilers, but it is titled The Second Age of Aquarius. It is a comedy, with a little bit of a Sci-Fi twist and a lot of music. It is sweet and clever. I am an Executive Producer and I act in it. I play Tawny Stevens. She is a young mom, stuck in the eighties, as a New Jersey, rocker mom. Wait until you see my hair, my make-up, thanks to Allison Noelle, and my leopard pants. I did the Jersey accent. I cannot wait for this film to come out and it has been a joy working post-production with this crew during COVID-19.

#### You recently starred in the film The Mourning. What drew you to the project and what can you tell us about your character?

The Mourning was genuinely one of my most memorable indie film experiences of my acting and producing careers. This production team, with Marc Clebanoff at the helm, is one I had previously acted with in films titled Gerald and Break, so I knew it would be a quality project. We filmed for a month in Holland, Michigan, the hometown of our writer and star, Michael Rene Walton. The town welcomed us like rock stars and this cast and crew formed such an incredible bond on location. I absolutely loved my supporting role of loud-mouth Lisa "Assface," and getting to work opposite seasoned, talented actors! Since I am also a Co-producer on The Mourning, please indulge me for a moment:

Produced by Marc Clebanoff, Michael Rene Walton, and Pepe Lobo. Co-producers Nadeem Soumah, Anoop Rangi, and Brooke Lewis Bellas. Cinematography by Nadeem Soumah. Written by Marc Clebanoff and Michael Rene Walton.

#### You have the TV pilot Stripped set to be released in 2021. What can you share about this project?

Runway Magazine, I am so excited to share this project with you and your fabulous readers! I have a spoiler alert I have been keeping, but can finally share, so you are getting the print "Exclusive." I will leave you in suspense until after I answer your question! Our production team spent most of the month of December 2019 in Reno, Nevada filming the TV pilot Stripped. It is a Comedy/Drama that was written and directed by Marc Clebanoff, who also directed The Mourning. Stripped was a passion project. I was one of the Executive Producers and producers, alongside Marc and Frank Krueger (who also stars in it). I play Jules, the sassy publicist to the star, Chris Cameron, played by the amazing Casper Van Dien. It was originally created by Mark Clebanoff and late actor, Kristoff St. John. They had created the concept before he passed on,

which is heart-breaking, but Marc wanted to carry on his legacy, and he did, and we did. Jules has easily become one of my new favorite characters I have been fortunate enough to play! There is an exceptional opportunity when writers create a role for you, specifically, and they write for your strengths as an actor. Jules is the lead female role in the series, but she is a supporting lead to Casper's Chris Cameron starring role. I emphasize this, as we just participated in the wonderfully professional NOVA Fest and TV and Film Market 2020 that director, Fernando A. Mico was forced to move to a virtual festival and convention like most events, due to COVID-19 this year. That said, Fernando and his production crew did it right and fabulously! They held the virtual awards ceremony streaming online in their tuxedos and gowns. I am humbly and graciously bursting to finally share that I was honored with the win for 'Best Supporting Actress in a TV Series Award' and I owe this all to Clebanoff for writing me this role and talented actors Casper Van Dien and Louis Mandylor for making me a better actress! We have such an incredible cast and series that we are all proud of. It will release in 2021.

# We were excited to hear about your upcoming streaming series Red Rooms. How did you manage to work on it during quarantine?

Thank you! I am excited, as well, but, like many creative projects, COVID-19 has certainly affected our pace of post-production. I feel it is important to share that, as so many creatives are struggling right now, and I want them to know they are not alone. At the very start the pandemic, my creative instinct kicked in and I knew I had to create to stay somewhat "sane", so I spent most of the quarantine producing and filming a virtual streaming series. Red Rooms was conceived and completed out of "isolation inspiration!" Joshua Butler and I had been in development on a project and had been reminiscing about our favorite industry days of yesteryear when we met on the horror film circuit. I had already been a superfan of Joshua's work for years. In October 2019, we shot a proof of concept for our project, which paid homage to his hugely successful film VLOG (2008) from the producers of SAW, which went on to become a hit TV series. When the pandemic hit Hollywood and we were all in isolation, I called for a production meeting, then suggested we use the footage we shot and attempt to experiment by filming each character virtually from their homes. Red Rooms stars horror film and TV veterans Brooke Lewis Bellas (iMurders), David Alpay (The Vampire Diaries), Suze Lanier-Bramlett (The Hills Have Eyes), Ricky Dean Logan (Freddy's Dead: The Final Nightmare), and Noah Blake (Teen Witch). We are currently finishing post-production and cannot wait to see where we end up in 2021!

### Tell us about your Twitter activity, how often do you tweet?

Far too often! I was never much of a Facebook person, so I took to Twitter early on. Or maybe it is that I have a lot to say, with strong opinions! I am incredibly grateful for any public or "celebrity" persona I may have, and I am very attached to my longtime fans and fanbase. I feel it is my duty and in my heart to connect with my fans, as well as giving back to charities and foundations as a proud philanthropist and activist! I also feel a strong responsibility to promote projects I act in and

produce, so our viewers and readers are always updated. I tweet several times a day, and make sure to answer all my fan tweets and questions. Now, please do not ask me about Instagram, as I am posting and commenting back so often it has become a part-time job!

## What is the funniest thing that has ever happened to you on set?

I have had many funny (and, not-so-funny!) things happen to me on set and productions! I truly feel that being an actor and producer in the independent film world involves a whole other level of funny and weird experiences! When you do not have big budgets to deal with, you have to get creative in other ways. So, one funny story that I would love to share was my experience of being one of the producers on a film titled Sinatra Club, that I was fortunate to get to act in, opposite Danny Nucci from Titanic, Jason Gedrick from Iron Eagle, Ellen Hollman from Spartacus, Michael Nouri from Flashdance, and the list goes on and on, with an incredible cast of talent we assembled. What was so cool was I found the script in 2004, we filmed in 2009, and it was distributed in 2011, so it was a very long and challenging development period for an indie project. One of the wildest memories I have was the fact that the film is based on a true story about the night John Gotti became John Gotti, so for all of the mobster history and movie buffs who are reading this, I was so fortunate to be a part of history in the making with this film. This film is based on Sal 'Ubatz' Polisi who went into the witness protection program for releasing information on John Gotti and his crew, and when he came out of witness protection, he wrote the story of his life in the Mafia. It was so wild to work on a project for so many years, where we would, literally, meet at 10 o'clock, 11 o'clock, 12 o'clock at night in privacy and secrecy at the Sportsmen's Lodge in Studio City, California, in hotel suites and we would hold our production meetings there! Only in Hollywood!

#### What is your favorite genre to work in?

Honestly, I just feel blessed to be a working actress for so many years. I have worked in a variety of genres, after starting my professional acting career in the Actors Equity Association's touring Musical Theatre companies and New York's Off-Broadway Mobster Comedy Tony n' Tina's Wedding. Mobster, or Mafia, crime genre projects are a forever favorite of mine! Then, after acting in Kinky Killers on Showtime, I had the title "Scream Queen" bestowed upon me in the horror and thriller genre years ago. I embraced being known in the horror genre, and referred to as a "Scream Queen", since my perception is that this title represents a "sexy, powerful actress in the horror genre." I am often cast in comedy due to my quirky characteristics and persona, but, honestly, when it comes to acting, I am always seeking to play very dark, dramatic, psychological, and intense character roles, as they are my absolute favorite. I love to dive into those deep, painful, and emotional roles in the drama genre.





#### Tell us about your favorite role.

I am so grateful to be a consistently working actress and producer for over 20 years, so it is impossible for me to choose only one favorite role! In the comedy world, my favorite roles tend to fall into the character actress roles that I so love to play and create, based on my favorite Philly/Jersey/New York people. One role that I am proud of, which is also my alter ego, was born out of the horror genre love and fame: Ms. Vampy. Ms. Vampy is a comedic mobster Brooklyn vampire with a heart of gold and I am proud of this character and all the projects that I have worked on with Ms. Vampy over many years. I am also proud of the fact that I was able to create something positive for teenage girls with her, including, not only a streaming series, but authoring my book Ms. Vampy's Teen Tawk: There's A Lotta Power In Ya Choices. Another role/project that I am incredibly proud of was playing Rosella in Sinatra Club, a film that I was one of the producers on as well. This was a passion project for seven years. I found the script in 2004, we shot the film in 2009 and it was released through several channels in 2011. It was based on a true story about the night John Gotti became John Gotti and the story of Sal 'Ubatz' Polisi. Rosella is a comedic mobster gumada, and it was just an incredible experience with the most amazing actors I could have dreamed of working opposite, including Danny Nucci, Jason Gedrick, Michael Nouri, and fellow Philadelphia native Joey Lawrence. Another favorite, I must shout out to, is an indie gem that I am grateful for, the role of Pam De Luca in the film ½ New Year. You can watch it on Amazon Prime or Tubi TV. Another talented Philadelphia native, Drew McAnany, created the Philly brother and sister roles for us to act in as Reed and Pam DeLuca. This was written with Georgia Menides and directed by Tom Morash. Lastly, we must add Jules from TV comedy Stripped, which we already discussed. However, the irony is, I love my dark, emotional drama performances I had the opportunity to play in Sprinkles and Psycho Therapy, which you can watch on Amazon Prime, more than anything. I hope to have a lot more of them in my career.

What's up next for you?

This is such an intriguing question for me, as I feel like we are living with so much "next" uncertainty. When I think about the next, and my next specifically, I used to only have tunnel vision about my career, for the most part. Now, I am working on being more present and spending time with the people I love, and on projects that inspire me. I realized that I have so much going on outside of the acting and producing part of my life, and that includes being an active philanthropist and being a Celebrity Ambassador for the Breaking the Chains Foundation for eating disorders and body image issues and cultivating our self-esteem and strength through the arts. I am currently becoming more active with other foundations and organizations that I have wanted to work with for quite some time but have never had the time to do so because I was so busy with my career, events, and

social life. I am really excited to be doing some work with my college sorority Alpha Epsilon Phi. I am doing a bunch of virtual speaking engagements on film and film festival panels, so that has been fulfilling for me as well. I am also actively promoting both of my books that I have been blessed to author, Coaching From A Professed Hot Mess for adults and Ms. Vampy's Teen Tawk: There's A Lotta Power In Ya Choices for teen girls which can be found at Amazon and Barnes & Noble. Last, but not least, I am so looking forward to spending quality time and drinking great wine, tequila, and bourbon with my hubby and our dearest of friends. Oh, how I cannot wait to be able to hit our favorite fine dining restaurants again...from Hollywood to Beverly Hills to Vegas, Baby! Rao's, Mastro's, Sinatra, please hold our table and lookout 2021!

#### Where do you go to relax?

Is this a trick question? My face should be posted next to the definition of workaholic, so the term "relax" is not very much a part of my daily habits, even during this pandemic! Pre-COVID, my husband and I used to relax by fine dining at our favorite restaurants and hotel lounges from Hollywood to Beverly Hills with friends, attending Broadway musicals at our favorite Pantages Theater, attending concerts at the Greek Theater or Hollywood Bowl, and heading to vineyards to attend wine tastings in Napa. These days, when I finally leave my home office at night, we binge-watch our favorite old and new series on HBO, Showtime, Netflix, and Amazon Prime. If you can believe it, we actually re-watched the full series of our old school favorites like Sopranos, True Blood, Sons of Anarchy, and Breaking Bad, during the pandemic. Then, at night, we head up to our amazing rooftop deck and bar for a nightcap and toast with our favorite wine, tequila, or bourbon. I feel very lucky to be able to do what we do during these challenging times!

#### What are your favorite colors?
