What are you currently working on and why?

Currently I'm working on changing the laws against Image Based Sexual Abuse. I helped create a bill called The Protect Act, this bill will help everyone against image based abuse. Recently Senator Mike Lee from Ohio sponsored this bill and Im trying to get this bill to get passed federally, so it will protect women, children and men all over this country.

Technology is updating everyday but the laws haven't changed, so we need better laws to protect the people as technology is advancing so rapidly.

I was one of the victims of the iCloud hack/leak in 2014, over 100 women including myself and Jennifer Lawrence, Kate Upton, Selena Gomez and many more had their private images, videos and information leaked to the internet, for everyone to humiliate, watch, bully and degrade. The media outlets covered this story as a "Scandal" but what happened to us wasn't a "Scandal" it was a sex crime. We all were digitally raped and trafficked online, everyone profited from the victims trauma, except for the victims of course.

People say be careful and don't take private pictures, videos and definitely don't share it but what they're failing to realize is that this can happen to anyone no matter how careful they are and they also don't need to be in the public eye for something unfortunate like this to happen to them.

In my case i was very careful, I never sent any pictures that showed any of my private parts, but my ex boyfriend took pictures and a video of me without my consent and later threatened to leak it because i broke up with him and refused to answer his calls, even though he didn't leak them, he sent them to my iMessage which got stored into the iCloud and a hacker that was stalking me and these 99 other women got a hold of them and auctioned us off on the dark web.

Currently there's a new technology that is called deep fake, where anyone can edit anyones face into pornographic images and videos, they're doing this to a lot of children and women and later even try to extort them for money, or even just profit from them by selling, sharing on various websites.

This not just an American issue but an International and we need the United Nations to step in and have better cyber laws and cyber police. I want to eventually turn the protect act into an international law. Since cyber space is international.

We need everyone to support The Protect Act, it's very important because there's so many children, women and men that are committing suicide because of these issues, they're losing their jobs, family, friends and so much more and it needs to be stopped. Please sign the survivor letter.

I also created a non profit called Foundation Ra and Protect Americas Daughters to better survivors and better help this cause as well.



My favourite role was Daniela from The Curious Case of Dolphin Bay! I love how there was a bit of complexity to her because she was dealing with so many different pressures in her life that weren't necessarily seen on camera, but certainly influenced her actions.

I have had a few different influences in different parts of my life. My parents were a huge influence on me and I'm so lucky they have been so supportive of what I want to do. Outside of my own family, I'm going to have to say gymnastics is what has influenced me as a person the most. I was competing, as well as training for 16 hours a week every week from a pretty young age which luckily forced me to learn that if you put in the hard work, results will come. That's so important in the acting industry, where everything can feel out of your own control. It helps to focus on putting in the work and making sure I'm enjoying that process.

What is your favorite thing in your closet?

I have a brown suede A-Line skirt from a store in New York called Moussy. I love how timeless it is, and of course, the memory of buying it too.

Where is your favorite place to eat?

I love a good poke bowl, and I just came back from the Gold Coast where we are staying near a 'Fishbowl' - which is the best poke I have ever had. I can't stop thinking about it.

Do you work with any charities?



JULIA VERDIN

Tell us about your personal style.

I would say my style is classic with a little twist. I wear a lot of a-line dresses and often like to mix vintage and modern pieces to make a more contemporary look.

How did you get into film writing?

I initially got into writing screenplays because I found myself searching for the type of stories I wanted to bring to life and couldn't find any. So, I decided to try and write one myself and found myself loving it. I'm currently writing my 5th screenplay!

Tell us about your creative process.

I firstly map out an outline of the various beats I want a story to touch on and then create detailed character histories for the main roles before I embark on a screenplay. Once I have a first draft, I send it out for feedback from people I trust. If it's a social impact movie, then I will consult with experts in the field to make sure the details are as authentic as possible. I also like to workshop scripts with actors to see what beats are working and what aren't. I often create several drafts and continue revising even as we are shooting as I get new ideas.

What is the basis for your non profit Artists for Change and how are you using your voice to make a difference?

Artists for Change is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization with a mission to create high impact film, television, and multimedia projects to inspire individuals, organizations, and communities to bring about positive social change.

I believe that an audience tends to go and see a documentary if they are already have an interest in an issue, but a narrative film can get people interested in an issue when they engage with the story and characters.

I'm very passionate about creating social impact tilms on topics such as child trafficking, domestic abuse, alcoholism. My goal is bring awareness to these issues via film, which is a medium that can really bring focus to these real-world problems.

Tell our readers about your latest project "Maya", and why was this film important for you to make?

Teenager Maya is raised in a household stricken by her father's abandonment. Her mother Camila resorts to seeking comfort in alcohol and an abusive boyfriend. As a result of no longer feeling safe in her own home, Maya searches for comfort outside of her family—finding it in Ray, an edgy, yet charming young man who befriends her online. He positions himself as Maya's protector and encourages her to escape her home life and move in with him. After a brief honeymoon period in Las Vegas, Maya soon finds out that tragically, Ray is not the shiny knight in armor that she believes he is. He's actually a pimp who manipulates her into a dark world of prostitution.

Maya aims to raise awareness on key issues including child trafficking, domestic violence, and alcoholism. It's inspired by true events and will show how predators use social media to lure vulnerable teens into their lair.

I have found that a large number of people think that trafficking is something that happens far away in other countries and so when they see the films I've made are surprised to find it is happening here in the US. We have to wake people up to the fact that it is happening right here, all across America, and get a really active education program going. There are a number of groups doing good work out there but they need more support in terms of funding and volunteers.

We also need to come together as communities and keep an eye out for foster youth and youth whose parents are struggling and not able to be present for them. They are particularly vulnerable to being trafficked.

I certainly don't have all the solutions but my hope is that my film will be used to raise awareness and get more visibility to this problem. When large numbers of people come together and put their minds to finding solutions change can happen. A narrative film can be a powerful way to engage and get people interested in an issue as a call to action. I hope that this film can be a cog in the wheel to do that.

Who stars in the film and can you elaborate on your casting process?

Maya stars Patricia Velasquez (The Mummy), Rumer Willis (Sorority Row), Rena Owen (Star Wars: Episode II – Attack of the Clones), Gian Franco Rodriguez (Halston), Billy Budinich (Frank and Penelope) and newcomer Isabella Feliciana as Maya.

I had long been a big fan of Patricia Velasquez's work and so when she agreed to come on and play the key role of Maya's mother, Camila, I was thrilled. She actually suggested Gian Franco Rodriguez for Diego and I had loved his work on Halston. Rumer Willis's agent suggested her for Kayla and I was already aware of her talent through her time on Empire. We met over Zoom and I knew right away that she would portray Kayla with the dignity the character deserved.

For the lead role of Maya, we auditioned a large number of actresses as this role needed someone who had a really strong emotional range and could bring authenticity and empathy to Maya. Isabella Feliciana blew us away in her callback and we all immediately knew she was a perfect fit. We had a similar situation for the role of Ray, a very complex character. Billy Budinich had an edgy charisma that this role needed and we were delighted to bring him on board.

Since Runway is a fashion publishing cation, can you let our readers know how you decided on the direction of the wardrobe for the characters throughout the film? If there were any changes in the wardrobe, what was the reason behind those decisions?

Our costume team, Camille Jumelle and Julia Perry, were amazing and really got fantastic clothes that portrayed the characters arcs with a great style. They both have great taste.

I like the characters wardrobe and color palettes to reflect their inner worlds. For example, I wanted Maya to be initially dressed Maya in colorful and creative clothes with patterns reflecting her inner child. Then, as her world becomes darker, she was dressed in bleak colors such as grey or blue to reflect the cold, uncaring world she has been thrown into and the hopelessness she feels.

Camila, Maya's mother, starts out in baggy, neutral colored clothing to portray her lack of self-esteem. As she gets sober and starts her recovery journey, her color schemes will become brighter, symbolizing her progression of hope.

When and where can we expect to see "Maya" in theatres?

Spring/Summer 2023

Do you have any pets?

Yes! I have an adorable rescue dog named Bear.

Tell us about the way you arrange your closet.

I like to color coordinate my closet and have sections for day wear, casual and evening clothes so i can easily find things.

What item in your closet could you not live without? My Artists For Change t-shirt! I also have a black fur trimmed shawl that I can throw over any outfit to make it look more glamorous as I often have to get ready in aa rush!

Do you do a lot of traveling for research?

Depends on the project but I enjoy it when I do!

I just got back from a tour across 17 cities in the United States for a documentary Americans with No Address, a companion piece to go with my next feature film, No Address. I interviewed people experiencing homelessness and those working with organizations and church groups that help them.

It was a difficult, heartbreaking yet rewarding experience that opened my eyes to the pervasiveness of homelessness and real-life challenges that these individuals go through. I have talked to people who had good lives and jobs and came from good families who, through different misfortunes, ended up on the streets.

What do you have coming up next?

No Address, a film I co-wrote and will direct, will begin principal photography in January 2023. It is about a group of characters who for various reasons have ended up on the streets and bond together and form their own family to survive the various challenges they face- see: https://www.noaddressmovie.com/

My goal with this film is to create a story that will emotionally resonate with the public and serve as a reminder that people experiencing homelessness are human beings that need our love, compassion, and help. These characters will capture the audiences' hearts and evoke empathy and understanding to the circumstances and situations that lead to homelessness.

After this film, I will be doing an upbeat family film Amy and Angel about a young deaf girl who after being thrown off the dance team by a jealous rival, trains the dog next door to be her dancing partner.
